Important Dates in Club's History

The Club was conceived by ten individuals at a meeting April 14th, 1975 with the assistance of representatives from Zone II Advisory Council.

The birth took place at the Terrace Restaurant April 29th, 1975 at 1.38 p.m.. Forty-eight persons were present.

An Executive was elected and sixty-two persons signed up. At the next meeting the Club was christened "Bay-shore Senior Citizens" Woodland Beach and District. It was also agreed the Number One priority was a hall of our own.

An offer to purchase the hall then known as the "Ship-A-Hoy" was made on June 12th, 1975.

We found that Government grants were easier to apply for than receive and the deadline on our offer was fast approaching. On November 15th, 1975, fourteen members stepped into the breach and bought the building to hold in trust until the Club was financially able to purchase.

Outside renovations were started immediately by our members with money raised by Club during the Summer.

Club meetings were first held in the Restaurant part of the Hall early in 1976. Renovations started on the inside of the Hall March the 10th, 1976.

With the assistance of a New Horizon Grant and money raised by the Club, Labour was provided by our members. A grant was receive from Wintario in 1977. The building was bought from the group of "Fourteen" in May, 1977.

A grant was received from Tiny Township in August, 1977.

The members have worked hard and are very proud of their three year achievement and hope they will now be able to sit under the tree they planted and enjoy it.
